P.S.E.D.

We are particularly focusing on helping children to resolve problems they have with each other by talking. They are learning to say when they don't like what someone else has done to them. They are also learning to talk to each other about taking turns.

Literacy

We have focused on letters y, z, (zz), qu this week. This means we have now covered all the single letter sounds as well as the double consonant digraphs. We have also been writing tricky words 'to' and 'the', and learning to read 'he' and 'she'. All reading groups are now reading Oxford Reading Tree books with text.

We have been learning about time this week, including lots of vocabulary to talk about time. We have learned days of the week, months of the year and put the four seasons in the right order. We have also tried lots of challenges against the clock, an exciting way to learn about much shorter time periods!
