#### Safeguarding

All schools have a duty to safeguard all pupils and our governors and local council check that we are meeting requirements. Safeguarding is another term for 'child protection'. Just a reminder that we have a safeguarding policy that is available on our school website. Miss Skelton is the new school designated safeguarding lead.

#### **Operation Encompass**

The school has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and West Midlands Police. Operation encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to 9am on the next school day when a child or young person has been exposed to or involved in any domestic incident.

Operation encompass will ensure that a member of staff, known as a key adult, is trained to allow them to liaise with the police and to use the information that has been shared, in confidence, while ensuring that the school is able to make provision for possible difficulties experienced by children, or their families, who have been involved in, or exposed to a domestic abuse incident. We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.


