Important Notice – Please Read

Dear parents and carers,

We have updated our whole school risk assessment and added the latest guidance for schools to the Covid-19 section of the website.

I would like to be clear about several protocols regarding Covid-19 and school procedures:

- If children are displaying persistent Covid-19 symptoms you should inform the school office, stay at home and book a test.
- The household should isolate until the result of the test.
- If you are unable to book a test you should self-isolate for 14 days.
- If a pupil or staff member tests positive for Covid-19, the school will be closed to that year group bubble for 14 days from the result of the positive test.
- Following a positive test, children and staff should isolate for 10 days and should not return to school unless they are fever free for 48 hours after the 10-day period.
- Year group bubbles will not close whilst a pupil or staff member are awaiting a test result.
- Due to GDPR, we are not permitted to inform parents if a member of the school community has taken a Covid-19 test and are waiting for the results.
- As before, if your child is sick, they should stay at home for 48 hours.
- In the event of a year group bubble closure, children will be taught remotely through Google Classroom as during the summer term
